More mid-Missouri counties utilize free or reduced lunch

The number of Missouri children living in poverty is decreasing, according to data obtained by Missouri KIDS COUNT. However, the number of students on free and reduced meal programs at schools continues to rise. Morgan, Pettis, and Audrain counties have some of the highest number of students on free and reduced lunch programs. Mexico Public Schools in Audrain County utilizes the Community Eligibility Program (CEP) to provide free lunch for elementary and middle school students.

Full price breakfast: \$1.30 Full price lunch: \$2.50

Total number of school days for 2017-2018 year: 171 days

\$1.30 x 171 =\$222.30 per student for breakfast \$2.50 x 171 = \$427.50 per student for lunch

Total per student per year: \$649.80

Reduced price breakfast: \$0.30 Reduced price lunch: \$0.40

Total number of school days for the year, 171 days \$0.30 x 171 = \$51.30 per student for breakfast \$0.40 x 171 = \$68.40 per student for lunch

Total per student per year: \$119.70
